<b>Course objectives</b>	Acquisition of theoretical knowledge of the basic, generally-accepted principles which pertain to the foundations of dogmatic theology in the context of the salvation of man and the world from death, by means of the corresponding liturgical and symbolic tradition of the Church, the conceptual and categorial apparatus and methodological study of dogmatics, mastery of the analysis of selected dogmatic texts, and the enabling of students to engage in comparative approaches to dogmatic disciplines.			
<b>Learning outcomes</b>	Development of a basic academic competence in dogmatics as well as in comparative theology, making use of relevant skills in the context of selected textual examples of the Church's dogmatic teachings with the aid of objective research methods and techniques.			
<b>Course content</b>				
<b>Lectures</b>	1. The concept of dogmatics and introduction to dogmatics as the basic theological doctrine on salvation. 2. Liturgical and symbolic foundations for dogmatic disciplines. 3. The Pneumatological and Christological nature of ecclesiology as the origin and starting point for dogmatics. 4. The ecclesiological nature of the revelation of the One God in Trinity (Father, Son, and Holy Spirit) through the Person of the Son of God. 5. The ecclesiological or liturgical and symbolic nature of divine revelation. 6. The liturgical, biblical, and patristic witness concerning the relationship between cosmology and ecclesiology. 7. The witness of the Christian tradition concerning the eschatological causes for the existence of the world as the Church. 8. The divine foundations of the Christian tradition concerning the hierarchical nature of the liturgical and symbolic manner in which the Church exists as an icon of the Kingdom of Heaven. 9. The Patristic witness concerning the various dimensions of the Divine Image in man. 10. The teachings of the Church on the creation of the world and man, the ontological and gnosiological implications of man's ancestral sin. 11. Dogmatic concepts of symbol, reflection, and enigma and their existential reflections (The liturgical and symbolic problems of gnosiology and the corresponding approaches of the simplified and yet multifaceted Christian view of the world after the Fall).			
<b>Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)</b>	Due to the specific nature of the Faculty, the curriculum, based on the Statute, includes special types of instruction, namely pastoral-catechetical and practical-liturgical praxes. These thematic units are then applied (with an insistence upon skilled analysis of relevant sources as well as active and productive usage of literature from both dogmatic and comparative theology.
