Lectures	1. The Philosophy of Man (Philosophical anthropology, ethics, philosophy of history, philosophy of politics and law, esthetics). 2. Logic and the Philosophy of Science (Logic, theory of knowledge, theory of reason, philosophy of science, philosophy of language). 3. Metaphysics (Ontology, philosophy of nature, philosophy of psychology, philosophy of religion). 4. Philosophical Eras and Thinkers. 5. Contemporary Philosophical Theory.			
Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)	Due to the specific nature of the Faculty, instruction consists of two separate forms of teaching in the same program, pastoral-catechetical and practical-liturgical praxis. Analysis of relevant texts, practicing independent exposition and observation of complex problematic connections, introduction to literature and the skill of linguistic expression.
