Course objectives	The purpose of this course is that students become familiar with the conditions for and trends in the formation and development of liturgical praxis and its theology within the context of our Local Church, and that they compare this knowledge with the praxis of other Local Orthodox Churches and learn to correctly understand and perform the divine services.			
Learning outcomes	Formation of an academic competency in order to understand and perform the divine services of the Church.			
Course content				
Lectures	Familiarization with the contemporary liturgical tradition of the Serbian Orthodox Church; Comparative analysis of the contemporary liturgical traditions of other Local Orthodox Churches; Comparative analysis of the contemporary liturgical tradition with heterodox Christian churches and faith communities; Study of the historical development of the contemporary rubrics of the Serbian Orthodox Church, the factors and circumstances which led to its formation, changes, and development; Acquisition of necessary theoretical knowledge in terms of ritual, the theology of the divine services, and their proper understanding as well as the history of religious rites in general.			
Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)	Due to the specific nature of the Faculty, the curriculum, based on the Statute, includes special types of instruction, namely pastoral-catechetical and practical-liturgical praxes. Includes work with handwritten manuscript collections in museums and libraries, educational trips and excursions. Other forms of teaching also take place- liturgical praxis with the aim of giving a special competence.
