<b>Course objectives</b>	<p>Arriving at a necessary level of literacy in English and a mastery of the scholarly form of the language to make use of theological literature written in the English language. A particular emphasis will be placed upon comprehension, analysis, and translation of professional, scholarly, and theological texts which are relevant for theological-catechetical students, as well as the Old and New Testament, divine service texts, Orthodox spiritual texts, and so on.</p> <p>Getting acquainted with grammar rules in English that represent an upgrade considering the material adopted in the first year of the study.</p>		
<b>Learning outcomes</b>	Development of basic academic competency in comprehension, analysis, and translation of scholarly and theological texts which are relevant for students of theological-pastoral program, along with accompanying applied, receptive, productive, and interpretive skills, knowledge of professional terminology, ability to apply new knowledge and skills in a professional environment, and proper mastery of the English language to the B2 level of the European Framework of Reference for Languages.

<b>Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)</b>	Familiarization with the lexicon and style of strictly formal, scholarly, and theological texts, as well as Orthodox liturgical and spiritual texts written in English, in an applied setting (with an insistence upon qualified analysis of relevant sources and an active and productive usage of unabridged literature from professional and scholarly sources written in the target language). Translation (from English into Serbian) and analysis of scholarly theological texts, organized debates on appropriate themes, and independent essay writing.
