Course objectives		Getting to know the basic features and history of the original text of the Holy Scriptures of the New Testament and Hellenic corpus of patristic literature. Getting acquainted with the Greek alphabet. Mastering the pronunciation of the Greek language. Acquiring the basics of the normative grammar of the Greek language with a focus on phonetics and morphology. Training for reading sentences and understanding simpler textual units in order to acquire the necessary abilities for further work on syntax, terminology and translation technique.		
Learning outcomes		Possessing the basic knowledge in the field of normative grammar of the Greek language, predominantly of the phonetics and morphology. Knowledge of the special features of the κοινή dialect and the New Testament Greek language. Capability for independent grammatical analysis of sentences and shorter texts (if necessary adapted) of the original text of the Holy Scriptures of the New Testament.		
Course content				
Lectures		Acquiring basic knowledge of the Greek language and in its framework of the New Testament Greek language, its historical development, appropriate literature and lexicographic manuals. Acquiring basic theoretical knowledge of Greek as an old literary and sacral language and its importance for the formation of Hellenic and European culture, with a special emphasis on philosophical and sacral terminology necessary for the study of theological disciplines. Greek alphabet. Pronunciation. Declension: of nouns (A declension, O declension, Third declension - vocal and consonant basics), adjectives (all three declensions, the comparison of adjectives), pronouns and inflected numbers. Adverbial forms formation. Conjugation (construction and meaning the form of the thematic O and aтемatic -μι conjugation). An overview of the uninflected words and basics of their function in the sentence. Getting acquainted with lexicographic manuals and relevant literature.
