Course objectives	Acquisition of theoretical knowledge on the main aspects of life of the Patriarchate of Pec during the Middle Ages. Mastering the skills of analysis of original documents relating to that period.			
Learning outcomes	Possession of advanced academic and general education competencies in the field of the history of the Patriarchate of Pec; development of critical theological-historical consciousness and historical-theological thinking; mastering of basic methodological principles, which will serve to acquire competences for independent research in archives, libraries and other institutions.			
Course content				
Lectures	The one-semester course will process the period from the proclamation of the Patriarchate in 1346 to the fall of the Despotate in 1459. During this time there were ten patriarchs of which Ephraim was twice on the Pec throne. The longest patriarch on the Pec throne was Patriarch Sava IV, the shortest Arsenius. Under the Empire there were two patriarchs; the others served when Serbia was a principality and a despotate. Of the ten patriarchs six were active during the Prince and Despot Stefan Lazarevic. Largest territorial spiritual jurisdiction was held by Joanikije; Arsenius held the least. All the patriarchs came to the throne after the death of their predecessor. Only once was the throne vacant by resignation. During this time Serbia had six rulers - two emperors, one prince and three despots. At the time of the first proclamation the Patriarchate Serbian state borders came close to Thessaloniki, and ahead of the fall of the Despotate – the state had been reduced only to Smederevo.
