God Logos; Son of God and Son of Man 8. New Testament pneumatology; Embodiment of the God of Logos, meaning and significance 9. Death of Christ; The law of sin and the shadow of death 10. The Resurrection of Christ; Pentecost - fulfillment of the promise of Christ 11. Church-announcement of a new reality; Unity of the Church 12. Baptism in the death of Christ; Eucharist - the realization of the Church 13. New Israel, royal priesthood, repentance and its ecclesiastic character 14.
