Course objectives	The aim of the course is to familiarize with the basic historical flows of the Orthodox Eastern Church, as well as mutual familiarization of the Orthodox peoples and their Churches.
Learning outcomes	Students will be acquainted with the basic historical flows of the Orthodox Eastern Church, that is, with the development of autocephalous Churches from the 11th century to the present.
