<b>Lectures</b>	This subject will explore the emergence of the basic elements and forms of the liturgical service of our Local Church and their subsequent development through centuries. Monuments and texts in which the liturgical theology of a certain epoch is expressed will also be processed. Students will acquire this knowledge directly at sources - handwritten and old printed worship books, frescoes, icons, chapel mobiliary and objects of applied Church art.		
<b>Practical classes (exercises, additional forms of classes, research work)</b>	Includes work with Museum and Library Manuscripts collections, study tours and excursions. Additional forms of teaching also take place - church-worship practice with the aim of giving special competences.
